

## David Fowler

### Politics and International Relations; Societies and Natural Environments

David Fowler is an historian of twentieth century Britain, with a research focus on the history and sociology of youth culture, student movements and cultural and intellectual biography. He teaches Modern British History and Sociology at the University of Cambridge and is an Honorary Visiting Fellow in the Department of History at the University of York. He has published two widely acclaimed monographs on twentieth century youth culture- *The First Teenagers: The Lifestyle of Young Wage-Earners in Interwar Britain* (Routledge, 1995) and *Youth Culture in Modern Britain, c.1920-c.1970: From Ivory Tower to Global Movement-A New History* (Macmillan, 2008)- along with several scholarly articles on student movements, Richard Hoggart and Postwar Youth Culture, and the interwar cultural commentator and pioneer of Anglo-German youth and student movements Rolf Gardiner. His cultural biography of Rolf Gardiner, *Rolf Gardiner and English Culture, 1920-1950: the Apostle of Youth*, will be published by Manchester University Press in 2017.
